Treasurer's and Financial Committee Report – L. Krute

Our current balance is \$53,112.70. This encompasses our BASS account which comprises approximately \$37,500 of this total. We have approximately \$15,585.59 separate from the past 5 years in profit from CIEC Conferences.

M. Barcic reported that ASEE has not mentioned division funds and there are no division expenses from the ASEE Annual Conference 2021.

There is no financial committee. At the Fall 2021 planning meeting, the board needs to review/consider future spending of these funds and understand not every CIEC will be profitable. Conference Reports

2021 CIEC – No Report 2021 ASEE - K. Plemmons 13 abstracts submitted, 1 rejected 4 published 4 diversity related <u>Reviewed sessions and topics</u> – concern with number accepted abstracts vs number at presentations? This also occurred in 2017 and 2018.

Research focused organizations this doesn't occur. Is this unique to our division or does this happen in more divisions?

- Timing from writing abstract to full paper 'reality sets in' budget issues occur
- Are there comparisons being made between technical vs professional development papers?
- How can CPD generate more papers in Summer 2022?
 - Pro-actively contact subject matter experts and request papers, don't wait for them to submit Approach as a team offer assistance
 - Offer workshop on 'how to write a successful paper'; may be of interest to younger faculty -provide as a service.
- Working professionals not accustomed to writing papers, this isn't their area of expertise. Offer a team approach. "Future proofing" the workforce Leadership/managers gap.
- Approach leadership institutes to publish in CPD?
- Should we consider providing compensation for best CPD paper at ASEE? Or reimburse author's expense to submit the paper?

CIEC 2022 - Marty Ronning reported on behalf of M. Carver – CPD has a sufficient number of sessions.

No assistant program chair for CPD at this time.

ASEE 2022 - Doug Ernie

- There is a new paper review system for 2022. D. Ernie will be sending a draft call for papers to the board for feedback for revisions. Keep the list of topics short (8 to 10).

New CMC Chair (as of this Conference) - Dora Smith (Siemens) CMC sponsored webinars this past year on managing during COVID and actions for remaining relevant. Stronger effort on workforce development with diversity/equity focus Oct. 2021 (face to face) meeting in Washington DC on Workforce development

Nominations for collaboration award – none. This award and process needs to be re-energized.

SIGs – Mark Schuver

Megan Balding (sp?) had agreed to chair marketing SIG group, however she has left USC and no longer involved with prof education – so need a new person. Mark is collecting suggestions for replacement. Everyone involved with SIGS are committed and involved – a lot of effort with presentations for past year

CPDD Website - Marty Ronning

Candace House Teixeira, content manager, continues to have issues with the web site in changing graphics, etc. Text updates – no problems.

Marty invited staff person at UMD to volunteer as support (replace support person from IA State).

ASEE – no response when asked to provide access to the support person from UMD.

Candace and the UMD support person need to meet to review the site. .

L. Krute reported that Craig Gunn is no longer the photographer for CIEC; will need to identify new person for CIEC pictures for CPD web site.

PIC V – M. Barcic

Most significant change to report – re-organization of the PICs. PIC V was 4 divisions now 11. ASEE Board meeting last weekend:

Award nominations down significantly this year. ASEE will be more pro-active in the future about reminding us about nominations.

ASEE requiring vaccine if visiting headquarters in DC, or if attending any ASEE hosted events. Future conferences will have recommended charity links to encourage P-12 and DEI Ethics Committee created based on few concerns this year, a few issues were:

1) a reviewer that was 'mean' (more than critical), some divisions complained;

ASEE has created reviewer expectations

Reviewer rubrics are more prominent, encourage more to complete the rubrics.

2) self-plagiarism issue.

3) meeting conduct/reviewer expectations

New committee on scholarly publications; working to place these under 1 umbrella by pulling in separate division publications (will have a rep from each division)

By-Laws for PICs – all PICs have same by laws – approved

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Distinguished lecture – disagreement on credentials of speaker.

Board reviewing this in more detail and may recommend changes. Pursue those who are experts in their fields rather than focusing on 'titles'.

Interdivisional town hall Committee - formalized and restructured

ASEE 2021 Conference Notables:

- o 3110 attendees at this year's ASEE annual conference (2020: 3263)
- o 1713 published papers (2020: 1762)
- Planning on 'in person' Summer 2021 in Minneapolis
- Abstracts not due until Oct 2021.
- Financial membership is declining and aging concern, working on younger members to join
- ASEE received P3 (twice) funds twice, both waived (repayment not required).
- o \$600,000 shortfall from 2021 conf, but optimistic about this upcoming FY
- ASEE didn't have to furlough any staff
- Best paper from each PIC PIC V paper *Teaching in the era of Covid 19 – A Reinvented Course Project for an Ocean Engineering Course*

Overall best PIC paper from PIC 1
